# Chaplain's Message:

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This week I was reading Pope Benedict's book 'Jesus of Nazareth', and his commentary on the Parable of the Prodigal Son. As I read what he said, I was reminded of an event in my own life. Pope Benedict said:

"The Prodigal (meaning reckless, wasteful, extravagant) son journeys 'into a far country'. The Church Fathers read this above all as an interior estrangement from the world of the father –the world of God- as an interior rupture of relation, as the great abandonment of all that is authentically one's own. He wants to live life in abundance as he understands it. He no longer wants to be subject to any commandment, any authority. He seeks radical freedom. He wants to live only for himself, free from any other claim. He wants to enjoy life; he feels that he is completely autonomous. But he experiences alienation and destitution. He strayed not only far away from home, but far away from himself, from the truth of his existence. He is an image of us all."

Not long after I learned to drive, when I was seventeen, I asked my dad one rainy night to borrow the car. As he gave me the keys he said "drive carefully". No sooner was I out of sight, I took off like Mario Andretti, enjoying the freedom and the thrill, completely ignoring what my dad had said to me.

You can imagine what happened. I hit a curb and burst two tires, front and rear, and had to call my dad to help me. As I waited for him to come I dreaded what he would say, and mentally practiced how I was going to explain all this. But he arrived, looked at the car, told me to get out of the rain -it was pouring- and proceeded to kneel down in the road, getting soaked, and jacked up the front, and then the back, to change both tires with the spares he had brought. I was mortified. I thought "What an idiot I've been, how foolish I am". I wanted the ground to open up and swallow me, as I watched my father get soaked to the skin as he changed the tires that I had burst. When he was done he didn't give me a mouthful, or a sermon, or a "What did I tell you?" He simply gave me the keys, and said "Drive carefully" and left.

Instead of anger, I received compassion. I don't know where my father pulled it from, but that was an experience I will never forgot. It began a change, a conversion of sorts, within me. God is compassionate, God has a heart, and this heart turns, so to speak, against God himself. God's heart transforms wrath and turns punishment into forgiveness. This compassion, this forgiveness is available to all of us. No matter what we have done, how ashamed we feel, we need not dread what will be said to us. We won't get sermons, or an "I told you so", but rather the love, compassion and forgiveness of a Father who comes out to meet us. Lent is a time when we are especially invited to experience this forgiveness in The Sacrament of Reconciliation. May all of us experience the mercy of God, whether or not we just passed our driver's test.
