Chaplain's Message: Easter Mercy

The second week of Easter is known as the Feast of The Divine Mercy. For some years, there were rumors and grumblings that the great Pope Saint John Paul II made this a universal Church feast because he was sharing solidarity with the Polish nun Saint Maria Faustina. This was not the case at all. The feast as we know it was instituted by Pope John Paul II at the behest of Jesus Christ Himself to the Polish nun. Nowhere ever before in history, did Jesus ask for a Feast to be instituted 14 times!! In her diary Jesus asked, begged, encouraged and shared His longing to have this feast made available for the entire Church. This is huge. And, unfortunately many dioceses and parishes worldwide don't celebrate it in the manner He wishes. My God, the graces that await us!

The entire message of The Divine Mercy (including the Feast) is simple. It is that God loves us – **all of us**. And, despite ourselves, He wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with an condition of trust, to receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others. Imagine how awesome our God is! In the world of today, with sin abounding all the more we need to **ask** God for His Mercy – beg for it! We need to **be merciful** – not just in the charitable work of the great family of Fr. McGivney, but equally in the home and with family.

Finally, we are called to completely **trust** in Jesus. Let Him do the work His way not ours! God wants us to know that all the graces of His mercy can only be received by our trust. The more we open the door of our hearts and lives to Him with trust, the more we can receive.

Spend time in prayer or even read more on The Divine Mercy, learn to trust in Jesus, and live your life as merciful to others, as Christ is merciful to you.
