### Past Grand Knight's Message - A HUGE THANK YOU

We faced many challenges and experienced numerous triumphs during the 2018-2019 Columbian Year. I am thrilled to report that due to the efforts of our Council membership, the Columbiettes, and friends of St. John's Council 1345, we were able to donate \$28,077 to numerous charities and organizations during the Columbian Year 2018-2019. Just an unbelievable effort by everyone! That is who the Knights of Columbus are, and that's what the Knights of Columbus does - fulfill the first principle of our Order - Charity and to continue the vision of our founder Father Michael McGivney.

We awarded \$7,100 in college scholarships to member's children and grandchildren. I thank Dr. Geoffrey Sadock for his leadership in this endeavor.

We raised \$10,022 from our Shake the Can Drive, from the proceeds of our Special Children's Dance and from donations from Fink's BBQ, Tommy Fox's and La Taberna. This money directly benefitted handicapped citizens in our community. I thank George and Nina Di Costanzo, Mike Cremin and John Graham for their undying efforts in support of this cause.

The organizations which benefitted from this massive and herculean effort of this Council are Bergen County Special Services Adult Programs, Camp Fatima of New Jersey, Felician School for Exceptional Children, New Concepts Disabled Children Foundation, New Day Community / Catholic Community Services, Intellectual Disabilities Fund, Norman Bleshman Regional Day School, Spectrum for Living, ARC of Bergen and Passaic Counties, TACA (Talking About Curing Autism), The Marble Jam Kids, and the American Special Children's Pilgrimage Group. Each of these organizations will receive \$800 from our Council.
