Chaplain's Message: The Stations of the Cross – A Lenten Reflection

The Stations of the Cross are a principal devotion in the Lenten Season. They recall 14 major moments that Jesus encountered on his way to His death on Calvary. They are illustrated both in the indifference and cruelty shown by those people who condemned Him, as well as in the kindness and compassion shown to Him by both loved ones and the stranger on the street.

For us, reflecting on the Stations of the Cross is also a very meaningful exercise in imaginative prayer. They call us to think of more than how Jesus sacrificed himself for our sins. He shows us what is really means to be human. In praying the stations, we imagine ourselves walking with Jesus on this brutal journey. Which character can you currently recognize in you this year walking this journey? The condemner? The mourner? The helper? The neutral observer? I assure you, in the various stages of our lives, we will be able to identify features of each character represented: we have all condemned someone, even behind their back; we have all reached out to help someone in need. We have also been "neutral" spectators of an event. Yes, we've often remained silent and apathetic when we should have been the voice of reason and justice. Despite ourselves, Jesus did this for us. His Mercy endures forever!

The Stations also corresponds to whatever is going on in our lives today and helps us focus on where and how we can become of reflection of Christ's love in it. As Brother Knights and Sister Columbiettes, we constantly find ourselves in the roles of Simon and Veronica, stepping out of our comfort zones and taking risks to help someone in need. We stand united as a voice for the voiceless (the unborn), we anticipate a certain need(s) before it happens, and we take the risk to help, knowing sometimes that we will probably receive little support in return. However, we do it for Jesus. He did it for us first. That's what matters.

Throughout His Passion and these 14 stations, Jesus teaches us how to love in the most difficult times: He remained steadfast, charitable, forgiving and observant to the needs of others. We are called to do the same. I invite you to enter into the stations of the cross more deeply this Lent. And wherever you find yourselves on the road to Calvary, know that Jesus walked it before us and is leading us on the way.

The AC units on the roof of the Council have to be replaced and, as you can imagine, that is no small cost. The units in place are 27 years old. The officers and trustees of the TBCC along with Gerry, Chuck and Ken are looking at several options to attempt to keep that expenditure at a manageable cost. I will report to everyone as we move forward, but we will be moving ahead quickly, because we cannot run the risk of losing rental income due to the failure of the AC system. If anyone has any questions about any issue relating to the building, I am always available to discuss.
