Chaplain's Message: Restoring our Spiritual Health this Lent

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Nature has given us the ability to experience five different tastes: sour, salty, sweet, savory, and bitter. But our society has almost completely eliminated all bitter tastes from its diet, substituting it for sweet things. Sugar, saccharin, and artificial sweeteners and abound! And the result is a very unhealthy imbalance in the metabolism.

The digestive system needs the stimulation of bitter substances in order to function properly. Excess sugar, and lots of sweet food, plays havor with our liver, as all the ancient and traditional herbalists, East and West, knew very well. Our liver is the metabolic laboratory of the body eliminating all kinds of poisons and toxins from our system, and producing bile, a digestive juice essential for the breakdown of fatty substances. The lack of bitter substances in our liver results in listlessness, a lack of vitality, and very poor digestion. So, treat your body well this Lent! Treat it well by giving up sugar and chocolate, and cream, and all sweet foods. Get a taste for bitter things.

What is true for the body is true for the soul! The soul needs bitter things, in order to eliminate the poison of sloth and complacency. Some people only feed their soul on sugary and "nice" things. They are all love, joy, peace, smiles, hugs and kisses. They want a nice wife, nice family, only nice meetings, nice Masses, nice homilies, nice hymns. They want to be surrounded by nice people. And they want nice brother Knights too!

But all this can ruin spiritual metabolism. We can end up soft, cushy, slack, comfy, cozy, flabby Christians. Very nice, but very unbalanced. The soul, like the liver, needs the bitter as well as the sweet. But do we really have the taste for it?

Lent is the opportunity to restore balance, to regain our health. Now is the time to taste some of the more "bitter" words of the scriptures; words that are anything but sweet and nice; words calling us to repent; words that can disturb our complacency, expose all our sin and hypocrisy, and move us to tears rather than smiles. These bitter words, these hard sayings, are a gift from God, restoring us to health and wholeness, to sanctity and sanity. Lent is an opportunity to do some real "bitter" penance, and to produce some real spiritual bile. During Lent we are invited to take up the spiritual weapons of prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

For those of you who wish, we will be celebrating Morning Prayer at 6 am every Monday thru Friday during Lent at St. John's in Bergenfield. A seat will be waiting for you.
