Chaplain's Message: All Saints Day

Dear Brother Knights,

Despite the balmy weather we have been enjoying here in New Jersey - we are forecast to hit 80 degrees this week, November is upon us. There are only two months in the year, January and November, which begin with a night of preparation. January is ushered in by New Years Eve, and November begins with Halloween. Trunk or Treat, Coopers Pond, gouls, goblins, demons, monsters....the streets are filled with children wearing costumes and masks as they go trick or treating on October 31st. 'Halloween' comes from 'hallow' and 'een.' 'Hallow' is familiar to us: 'Hallowed be thy name'. 'Hallow' means 'Holy', and 'een' is a derivation of 'eve'; the eve of what is holy, or the eve of all hallows. Halloween is a preparation for All Saints Day, November 1st, and All Souls Day, November 2nd. It is meaningless to celebrate Halloween without celebrating All Saints Day.

Friday November 1st, All Saints Day, is our Feast Day: we have been created to be Holy and Immaculate, to be saints. Halloween prepares us for All Saints Day by mocking demons, goblins and monsters, in other words, the devil; scary costumes are worn to poke fun at him. In the Middle Ages the devil was portrayed with horns, a tail and pitchfork, a caricature which was meant to ridicule and mock him, because he has been vanquished by Christ's death and resurrection. The devil can't stand to be laughed at, he can't stand to be mocked, to be ridiculed. Why? because he is proud, he is not humble. The proud cannot bear to be made fun of, or to be the butt of a joke. A proud person does not like making mistakes, for fear of being laughed at.

But on Halloween we do precisely that, we mock him, laugh at him, because he has been vanquished by the Lamb, Jesus Christ. The devil does not want us to be holy, to become saints; but we laugh at him because the head of the serpent has been crushed by the heel of the Virgin. All Saints Day is our Feast Day, the grace of God can allow us to be holy, as He is Holy. Immediately following All Saints Day, we celebrate the commemoration of All the Faithful Departed. November is the month in which we pray for All Souls. We remember especially our brother Jim Callahan, and all our brother Knights, our family members and friends, who have preceded us into Eternal Life.

Jim Callahan Remembrance

At this mass we pray for Jim Callahan's soul, remember him fondly, and give thanks for his life, for his being among us. I'm a relative newcomer to the order of the friends of Jim, who are many. I came to know him when I became active in the Knights of Columbus. I also knew Jim as a CCD teacher in this parish. Our other connection was Tri Valley Diner, where we spent many a night dining on one of the specials as we debated the merits of the wait staff, some theological question, or politics. Jim had high standards for the wait staff at the diner and appreciated the ones who did the small things right, like fill up his water glass without being asked to do so. Jim also had high standards for the Knights, for the Catholic Church, and for himself.

His favorite slogan was "Where there is a need there is a Knight." He was like a gadfly to our council, always looking to get things done without worrying too much about organizational protocols, or hearing someone say "that's not the way we do things here." So he took the lead on ensuring that each month, we had a priest available to say mass for the residents of the New Jersey Veterans Home. Keeping that legacy going, some of our brothers were there earlier this morning to assist with that charitable task.

Jim also loved to arrange events at the council that would attract more people to us while raising funds for charitable causes such as veterans or the people of Ukraine. In his efforts on Ukraine, he went so far as to speak to a high official of the Knights in Poland in an effort to have us communicate with brother Knights who were on the front lines assisting Ukrainian war refugees.

Another activity Jim spearheaded was group prayers. It went like this, emails went out to our members requesting all to say an Our Father for peace in the Ukraine, or to end violence in this country and around the world. The emails would be shared outside our circle of Knights and Columbiettes, so a wide prayer network was being activated.

I admired Jim's creativity and independent thinking both as a teacher in preschool and in the CCD program. Jim strongly believed that education had to be centered on the student, not the teacher or administrators. Often this belief put him at odds with whoever was in charge. In the CCD program teaching middle-schoolers, Jim always got the kids involved in the learning. His proudest moment came last year when his CCD students created, composed, and delivered a prayer service for peace and an end to violence. It was done right here in the church and received excellent reviews from the DRE and those of us who attended.

In his last days, Jim expressed appreciation for the care he received from his family and friends, especially those knights who were there by his side constantly. In this time, he was devising plans for a program that would have us reaching out to shut-ins and hospital patients who had no one to visit them.

I mentioned how Jim and I would eat dinner together at the diner and get involved in heated conversations about religion and politics. Jim thought religion should be simple and emphasize charity and tolerance. I usually found myself opposed to, or at least to the right of Jim's positions. Yet I learned from him. As the diner would be getting ready to close and the staff patiently waited for us to pay our bill and get out, we would say to each other, "Well we didn't solve the problems of the world tonight."

No we haven't solved the problems of the world yet Jim, but you have proved yourself, a steady soldier in the fight for right and justice. You have been a good brother, uncle, friend, Knight of Columbus. We will not forget you! We would do well to honor your legacy!
