Chaplain's Message: The Triumph of the Cross

Through Christ's action, (His death on the Cross) the symbol of what was known as humiliation and defeat was transformed into a symbol of liberation and triumph. Today that symbol — the Holy Cross — remains the universal image of Christian belief. The feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross on September 14th shows that through the Cross and its sufferings come victory! And, reconciliation is a sign of God's love freely given. It is an opportunity for us to share and become like Jesus Christ, whether it be something as simple as making the sign of the Cross or in the communion of our daily struggles and sufferings.

When we place a crucifix in churches and homes, in classrooms and other institutions or when we proudly wear the image on our person, we are constantly reminded of the witness of Christ's triumph — Jesus' victory over sin and death. The formation of the Knights was founded on the Cross. It is the central "signature gesture" brother knights use when greeting and identifying one another. Blessed Michael wanted it so in order for the Knights of Columbus to constantly express divine hope to those in despair through Jesus' triumph of the Cross.

I pray we will be ever more conscious of the power of the cross. I pray that we will be more grateful to Jesus for His Triumph on the Cross opening the doors for us to eternal life.
