Chaplain's Message: the Feast of the Holy Family

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

How would you describe your family? Which adjective would you use? Caring? Loving? Neurotic? Dysfunctional? Middle class? Stable? Troubled? Peaceable? I don't know how many of us would use the word "Holy." Immediately after Christmas, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Holy Family, Jesus, Mary and Joseph. The Holy Family of Nazareth is an icon, an image of what each of our families is called to be. The members of the Family of Nazareth have a secret, their holiness comes not from their relationships with one another, but from the fact that they each have a relationship with God.

Holiness is a gift, but it is also something that needs to be discovered, nurtured and desired. None of us choose the family we belong to, but one thing is for sure, the family we belong to is called to be holy; and this holiness, the secret to family life, begins with you. If we wait for the others to be holy things are never going to happen. God is calling you, not your brother or sister, or father or mother, or spouse, to be holy. But is that something we really want, or even think about?

Jesus, separated from his parents and lost for three days as a young boy is "in his Father's house." Mary will "keep all these things in her heart," and Joseph, the silent presence of fatherhood, will help the child grow and mature, to become obedient not to him or his wishes, but to God, his real father. Any parent who has ever lost a child knows the anguish and the frantic fear that is felt. Mary and Joseph lost Jesus not for ten minutes, or half an hour, but for three whole days. Can you imagine! When they eventually found him they did not box his ears, or get mad, or collapse in tears as they hugged him to bits, but accepted what he said: "Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house." They understood that he was doing what they had taught him to do, to seek God, to do God's will, to put God first in his life.

But the child's holiness will not mean a cold distancing from his parents, but rather his being obedient to them, his learning to obey. Not an easy thing to do – to obey someone else, especially if you think you know better. After all, he was the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity, he knew better than his parents; and yet he obeyed them. In doing so he learnt to obey God the Father, and this obedience will make him holy. Also, Mary and Joseph know that the child does not belong to them. He is not their property, he is not their project, their hobby. They are custodians of a child who, as every child, is called to be a child of God. This will mean "keeping things in their heart." They will learn to suffer and to love this child who, through them, is called to be son of his Father. They will put God first in their own life, freeing the child to do what God asks of him.

All our families are infused with the holiness of God. This holiness is the secret of our communion, our relationships with each other, our love for one another. We can rediscover this holiness today, the Feast of the Holy Family, when God speaks to our hearts. He will speak to your heart. May he make of us his children, and in doing so teach each of us how to be a parent, a grandparent, a spouse, a son, a daughter, a brother, a sister, in the holy family to which we belong.
