Chaplain's Message: 'Simon, son of John, do you love me?'

Seven of the disciples, including Simon Peter, had gone fishing at the Sea of Tiberias. They had left their nets and boats when Jesus called them to follow him at the beginning of his ministry. Now they were returning to their old way of life. They still do not believe that Jesus is Risen from the dead, they have forgotten all that they have experienced.

The Fathers of the Church say the greatest sin is that of forgetfulness. To forget what God has done in one's life. To forget the marvels of God is to steal his glory. It is what makes salt lose its taste. We too have the temptation to forget what God has done in our life. While each one of us is witness to miracles of His love, it is all too easy to relegate them to the past. They become distant faded memories, explained as being merely luck, happenchance, or moments of enthusiasm.

The seven disciples want to go back to their former way of life. Just as the people of Israel wanted to go back to the slavery of Egypt. Seven denotes the number of the Pagan nations; the disciples are on the Sea of Tiberias, the pagan name of the Sea of Galilee. They are returning to a fruitless, empty, pagan way of life. Having caught nothing, which is what always happens when we do things according to our own reasonings without taking into account the Risen Christ, they see Jesus standing on the shore. Jesus addresses Peter as 'Simon Son of John!' Nowhere in the New Testament does it say that Simon Peter's father was John. In addressing him this way, Jesus is referring to the High Priest par excellence of the Old Testament, whose name was Simon Bar Jonah, or 'Simon Son of John.' Simon Peter is the New High Priest of the Church that Jesus is founding. This Church is formed on love. Three times Jesus asks him 'Do you love me?, recalling the three times Simon Peter disowned him. In English the translation is lost, but in Greek there are two different words for 'love' which Jesus uses. The first two times he asks 'Do you 'agape' me?' Agape being the highest form of love. To which Simon Peter responds with confidence 'Yes.' The third time Jesus asks him 'Do you 'philos' me?' Philos is the lowest form of love. It is necessary to love in small things before the great. Be faithful in small things, and the great will take care of themself.

All of us have betrayed Jesus three times and many more than that. We too have the temptation to live a pagan life. But Christ Risen appears in our midst in today's liturgy. His mercy and forgiveness offer the possibility to follow him, and to love him in small things. In doing so, we will discover that the great things will take care of themself.
